- This week, we've seen images on television of the country of Egypt going "beserk." But spiritually speaking, Egypt could well be a descriptive picture of God's people – His Church – gone beserk. What are we to do? What is the way back to God and godliness?

I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted. Isaiah 6:1

LORD = Yaweh; the personal name of God; meaning "to be or to cause"

Lord = Adonai; most exalted title of God; meaning _____

"Adonai" emphasizes the servant-master relationship and thus suggests God's authority as Master; One who is sovereign in His rule and has absolute authority.
