

## Introduction:

- A thank you note usually consists of three components: an acknowledgement of something nice that was done, an affirmation of some quality in the one who gave the gift, and often a short word of encouragement.
- In closing his letter to the Philippians, Paul gives one of the best thank you notes I've ever come across.
